<sup>\*</sup>ruler \*Paper cutter (optional) water containers

<sup>\*</sup> scissors \*assorted acrylic paints

<sup>\*</sup>Keepsakes- trinkets, buttons, old jewelry, beads, ribbon, lace

<sup>\*</sup>Paper- photos, maps, newspaper, vintage stamps, movie tickets, scrapbook paper, children's art

<sup>\*</sup>Other stuff- marbles, small toys, doll parts, ruler, cloth tape measure, use your imagination
