OIL PAINT

Oil Paint can get expensive. We suggest looking at several retailers to find materials that fit your budget. Locally- Michael's, JoAnn's, Hobby Lobby. Online- Dickblick.com, Jerrysartarama.com CheapJoes.com

Paint Colors

These can be 37 ml size tubes (except white):

Cadmium Red OR Pyrrole Red

Alizarin Crimson OR Quinacridone Magenta

Ultramarine Blue

Cerulean Blue

Cadmium Yellow OR Hansa Yellow OR Bismuth Yellow (Cad Yellow is my preference)

Lemon Yellow OR Cadmium Lemon

Yellow Ochre

Titanium White 150 ml

Burnt Umber (optional)

Canvas or Canvas Board

you will need at least 3-4 - you can choose your size in 8 x 10, 10 x 12, 12 x 16 - anything larger is a lot to try to cover

Brushes

3 - 5 will be needed at minimum. You can use bristle type in sizes that are 1/4" - 3/4" in width in either a "flat," "bright," or "filbert" shape, and synthetic brushes in the same size and shape. The type of brush hairs - bristle versus synthetic - is a personal preference, I like both types for different things, so I would suggest getting at least one bristle type to try it and the rest could be synthetic which are a bit easier to use.

Other

- Pad of palette paper
- **Gamblin Solvent-Free Gel Medium**
- Paper Towels (Viva brand that is NOT textured work well)
- Metal palette/mixing knife
- **Odorless** mineral spirits such as Gamsol made by Gamblin.
- Bring an apron or paint shirt (or wear old clothes)
