If you have acrylic supplies already, bring them. No need to spend a bunch of money unnecessarily. If you have any questions about what you have regarding whether it will work, shoot me an email and we can talk.

Acrylic Paints

Master's Touch is on sale 50% every other week at Hobby Lobby. Catch it right and you can pick these up for about \$2.00 per tube. This is a HUGE savings!

Liquitex Basics are about a dollar a tube more expensive than Master's Touch. *You can also buy these paints in smaller sets that may or may not have all these colors. It's worth looking into.

Recommended colors are approximate and may be named differently by brand:

White Black Naples Yellow Raw Sienna Lemon Yellow Cad Yellow Medium Cobalt Blue Ultramarine Blue Alizarin Crimson Cad Red Pthalo Green

Paint Brushes

Master's Touch brushes are also on sale 50% off every other week. The white or gold taklon should work well. I recommend a **flat in sizes #12, 6, and 2, a script or liner brush and a small round bristle brush** for sketching your painting.

Canvas

Master's Touch canvas works great. I prefer the texture of watercolor canvas, but that is just me. 9x12" should be good. These come in a five pack so you can split the costs with another student if you like.

Palette

Master's Touch. I use a glass palette most of the time, but these inexpensive paper palettes work wonderful and they are cheap!

Easel

You will need something to hold your canvas at an angle. I recommend a tripod or Julian easel, but the table easels work if you bring something to set it on. These low end easels will work great for that! And guess what?

Working outdoors

Don't forget a wide brimmed hat, insect repellent, water buckets, spray bottle for misting your palette, paper towels, pencil and paper for any notes. You may want to bring a chair and small table to work from. Anything you can think of. Come with a good attitude and be prepared to have fun and learn!
